Enrichment Days this half term:

Comet

Class Comet has had a great term this Autumn. We have been learning about Benin in Topic and have been to the World Museum in Liverpool to explore the different artefacts from Benin. In English, we have been studying stories by Michael Morpurgo, such as The Rainbow Bear, The Sandman and the Turtles, and The Dolphin Boy. We have created some great pieces of writing around these stories. In Maths, we introduced and expanded our knowledge of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.



Coronation

KS1 Coronation have enjoyed lots of fun learning this term. In Topic they have been focusing on famous people and have looked at the expeditions of Christopher Columbus, Neil Armstrong, Ernest Shackleton and Tenzig Norgay. In science they have been focusing on materials and their properties and in English they have enjoyed lots of stories by a variety of authors.



KS2 Coronation have had a wonderful half term and have taken part in lots of amazing lessons. In English we have learnt about performance poems. The children have put their memory to the test and have learnt new skills to help them memorise a poem. The children have then created their own performance poem and enjoyed performing these to their class, using all their new skills. KS2 Coronation have also learnt about Christianity in Religious Education. This included learning about the true meaning of Christmas and why some traditions are still followed today. We then enjoyed planning a meaningful gift for a class peer, buying the gift and finished off by giving and receiving the meaningful gifts.

It has been an eventful first term for class Torbay. We have had visits to college careers events, visited the University Academy 92 in Manchester and enjoyed our own college days on a Friday. Class Broadsman have had a super Autumn term!

KS2 children have enjoyed exploring light and shadows, and lifecycles of animals and humans in science. In English, they listened to the story 'The Dolphin Boy' and visited Talacre beach to explore a similar setting. Throughout Topic, they have been learning about Benin and created some beautiful artwork to replicate Benin artefacts. During Maths, the children explored 'greater than' and 'less than' when comparing amounts and used Numicon shapes to consolidate learning of number bonds.

KS1 looked at many different types of short stories that we really enjoyed reading and completing our work based on them. We worked hard in science this term exploring life cycles of different animals in KS2, we even had the chance to visit blue planet aquarium. KS1 children completed amazing work about materials. We also really enjoyed our PE lessons this term going to swimming and horse riding.

Class Orient have been looking at light in science, they visited the Science Museum in Manchester for the Science festival, where they took part in investigations in light. We have learnt how to use writing to persuade, looking at the pros and cons of Zoos. We went pumpkin picking, where we walked Shetlands ponies and showed our respects to those who fought in the War at the Crewe memorial. In PE we have enjoyed going LS Gymnastics, improving our skills in jumping, forward and backward rolls and cartwheels. We have learnt all about Benin and made our own Benin houses made from clay.
